SR-NASDAQ-2016-021 Amendment No. 1

The NASDAQ Stock Market LLC ("Nasdaq" or "Exchange") is filing this Amendment No. 1 to SR-NASDAQ-2016-021 to make the following changes:

- 1. In the partial paragraph on page 7 of 63 of the 19b-4, as well as the partial paragraph on page 37 of 63 of the Exhibit 1, replace "(2) short-term high-quality U.S. government and agency securities;⁹" with "(2) U.S. government and agency securities;⁹".
- 2. After the second full paragraph on page 26 of 63 of the 19b-4, as well as after the first full paragraph on page 56 of 63 of the Exhibit 1, insert the following language:
 - "All statements and representations made in this filing regarding (a) the description of the portfolio, (b) limitations on portfolio holdings or reference assets, or (c) the applicability of Exchange rules and surveillance procedures shall constitute continued listing requirements for listing the Shares on the Exchange. In addition, the issuer has represented to the Exchange that it will advise the Exchange of any failure by the Fund to comply with the continued listing requirements, and, pursuant to its obligations under Section 19(g)(1) of the Act, the Exchange will monitor for compliance with the continued listing requirements. If the Fund is not in compliance with the applicable listing requirements, the Exchange will commence delisting procedures under the Nasdaq 5800 Series."

The Exchange believes that the proposed rule change, as modified by this amendment, is consistent with the requirement of Section 6(b)(5) of the Securities

Exchange Act of 1934 that an exchange has rules that are designed, among other things, to prevent fraudulent and manipulative acts and practices, to promote just and equitable principles of trade, to remove impediments to, and perfect the mechanism of a free and open market and, in general, to protect investors and the public interest.

The proposed rule change provides that the statements and representations in the filing, as referenced above, constitute continued listing requirements for listing the Shares of the Fund on the Exchange; that the Exchange will monitor for compliance with the continued listing requirements; and, that, if the Fund is not in compliance with the applicable listing requirements, the Exchange will commence delisting procedures. The proposed rule change, therefore, facilitates the Fund's continued compliance with Exchange rules and the representations in the filing. In addition, this amendment clarifies the Fund's investments in U.S. government and agency securities

All other representations in the filing remain as stated therein and no other changes are being made.
